

- 1) Presented the October 2010 Community Enhancement Award to Thomas and Zelda Reiss for improvements to their building at 131 Pennsylvania Avenue (the old Hilliard's Barber Shop building).

12) Heard the old Wrangler building on Virginia Avenue is slated for demolition within the next few weeks.
