- 1) Approved a request to close Town Hall from July 11th through July 13th, 2017 in order for staff to close out the books for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 and to set up the new Fiscal Year 2017- 2018 and prepare for the Town's audit.
- 2) Reviewed May 2017 Town Vehicle Gas Log.
- 3) Reviewed the May 2017 Website Statistics.
- 4) Reviewed the May 2017 Police Department Activity Log.
- 5) Reviewed the May 2017 Police Vehicle Log.
- 6) Received a letter of resignation from Cathy Breeden. Ms. Breeden will be stepping down as the volunteer host of the Motorcycle Show held during the Town's Memorial Festival.
- 7) Received an invitation to the Shenandoah Vision Team Meetings on Saturday, June 17, 2017 at 10:00 A.M. and/or June 29, 2017 at 6:30 P.M. The Vision Team is a group that meets to consider the future economic health of the Town of Shenandoah. Town residents, business owners, and all with interest in economic development in Page County, and specifically the Town of Shenandoah, are invited to one or both community meetings held at the Shenandoah Community Center.
- 8) Received information for the C.E.R.T Youth Emergency Preparedness Training, which is for ages 12-16. This **free** training will be held June 21st, 22nd, and 23rd, 2017 from 10:00 A.M. until 2:00 P.M. at the Page County Extension Office. Register today to help your family prepare for emergencies or natural disasters, and get a firsthand look at the equipment that is used in emergency situations.
- 9) Received an invitation to attend Bull Run III on July 29, 2017. All motorcycle riders are invited to ride from the Old Dominion Harley Davidson in Fredericksburg to the VFW Post 8613 in Shenandoah. A \$25 donation for the rider and \$10 donation for a passenger will be collected and all proceeds will be donated to the Virginia Veterans and Family Support Program. The donations include a complimentary lunch and riders can pre-register at www.bullruniii.org. (Note: This year's route has been changed; instead of coming through Shenandoah from the North, the riders will be coming from the South up 340 N., turning right onto Maryland Avenue by the 7-Eleven, and left onto Eleventh Street to the V.F.W. Post 8613.)
- 10) Received a thank you letter from The Gus Bus for the Town's recent donation. The Gus Bus is a mobile literacy program that helps to bring literacy opportunities into the neighborhood of students.
- 11) Mayor Lucas and several council members will be attending the Stanley Homecoming

Parade at 5:00 P.M. on Saturday, July 1, 2017 as well as the reception that will be held prior to the parade at the Stanley Fire Hall from 3:00-4:30 P.M.

- 12) Approved a water and sewer connection for Klass Homes on lot 19 in the Forrest Knolls Subdivision.
- 13) Council is still reviewing options to provide sewer to undeveloped areas of Wahnona Avenue and other surrounding locations.
- 14) Heard the Route 602 Bridge is scheduled for improvements in early 2018. The project will require six to eight months of work and, at times, will require closing one lane of the bridge.
- 15) Committee Chairman Jenkins reported the following Parks and Recreation News: The new restroom at Big Gem Park will be completed soon. Once the ceiling has been put in and the final inspection is complete, the restroom will be open for use.
- 16) Heard a request to clear out the hiking trails at Big Gem Park. Some maintenance has been done to the trails, and the Town will continue clearing them out in the upcoming weeks.
- 17) Heard there will be workshops to support small business growth held in the month of June. "Don't Just Survive... Thrive!" will be held on Wednesday, June 21st from 5:30-7:00 P.M. at the County Administration Building in Luray. "Staying Relevant to a Changed Customer" will be held on Friday, June 23rd from 8:30-10:00 A.M. at the JMU Ice House in Harrisonburg. The workshops are free and help business owners, managers, and employees to focus on getting found, capturing interest, and converting consumers to paying customers. Pre-registration is required at www.valleysbdc.org.
- 18) Heard most of the water leaks in Town have been repaired and the parts needed for the sewer plant have been ordered and are scheduled for delivery by June 23rd.
- 19) Heard the Town received \$5,000 of the requested \$15,000 from Page County's Transient Occupancy Tax, to be used for marketing of the Town. The Board of Supervisors denied the Town's request of \$10,000 for upgrades in the Town parks.
