

## Town Council Actions June 27, 2017

### Page 1

- 1) Heard an animal control complaint from Andrea Comer and Stephanie Richards concerning a dog on the property adjacent to their father's.
- 2) Heard a request from Betty Wriston for the Town to move her mailbox, due to her recent address change.
- 3) Approved a request to allow Town employees to be off July 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017 in observance of the Holiday.
- 4) Heard a memorandum from Councilman Pierce asking the Council to table the zoning request from Jasel Group, LLC. After further discussion the Council voted to authorize the vacating of an undeveloped street of record and adjustment of lot lines within the Forest Knolls Subdivision by Jasel Group, LLC, per the provided survey plat.
- 5) Approved a consolidation of lots request from Superior Siding & Home Improvement, Inc.
- 6) Received information for Genealogy Workshops to be held at the Shenandoah Computer Center. The workshops will be "Putting Down Roots" on Saturday, July 22 and "Spreading Branches" on Saturday, August 19, 2017 from 9 A.M. to 12 P.M. Each workshop will cost \$10 to cover the facility and the handouts made available. Please call 540-652-8773 to make your reservation, as seating is limited.
- 7) Approved a water and sewer connection for Superior Siding & Home Improvement, Inc. on Shenandoah Avenue.
- 8) Approved a water and sewer connection for Superior Siding & Home Improvement, Inc. on Lot 9 on High Knoll Terrace.
- 9) Approved a bid from Hensil Good Paving, Inc. for two asphalt patches on Eleventh and Second Streets. The bid on this project was placed at \$1,900.00.
- 10) Committee Chairman Jenkins reported the following Parks and Recreation News: The new restroom at Big Gem Park is open for use! The restroom will be closed during the winter, but open to the public the rest of the year.
- 11) Heard there is a possible franchise interested in bringing their business to the former McDonald's building.
- 12) Committee Chairman Kite requested that a Community Enhancement Award be given to Shenandoah Baptist Church. The award will be presented at the Town Council meeting on July 11, 2017.

- 13) Reminded the Council of the Shenandoah Vision Team Meeting to be held on June 29, 2016 at 6:30 P.M. at the Shenandoah Community Center. The Vision Team is a group who meet to consider the future economic health of the Town of Shenandoah. Town residents, business owners, and all with interest in economic development in Page County, and specifically the Town of Shenandoah, are invited to one or both community meetings held at the Shenandoah Community Center.
- 14) Heard the Shenandoah Time Trial Bicycle Race went well. There were at least 159 bicyclists who came out to participate in the race with an excess of 300 visitors in the Town. Most businesses reported an increase in sales on the day of the bicycle race and Box Car Deli reported one of their biggest days of sales since opening.
- 15) Heard the Page County Movie Night brought in over 250 people for the resource fair and movie. There were twelve vendors set up at the resource fair offering free items and activities for the families. Some of the interactive vendors included the Luray Zoo, Home Depot, Mr. Ed's Barrel Train, and a bounce house provided by the Town of Luray. The next Page County Movie Night will be held on July 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 in Luray with Finding Dory playing, and the final Movie Night will be held on August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 in Stanley with Moana playing. The movies are free to the public and include a free popcorn and drink.
- 16) Mike Uram expressed his appreciation for the Mayor and Council's work in Shenandoah. Mr. Uram also congratulated the Town on their first successful Movie Night. He was in attendance for the Movie Night and stated he was pleased to see all of the Town employees working hard together to make it such a success.
