- 1) Presented the September 2017 Community Enhancement Award to Kevin and Kristin Zwanzig in appreciation for the work they have done to their home.
- 2) Matthew Queen presented a slideshow to Mayor Lucas and Council Members to show three proposed sites for a possible archery range at the Big Gem Park. After a brief discussion, the Council agreed they would like to see an official plan for one of the proposed sites and will be looking further into the insurance requirements for an archery range on Town property.
- 3) Approved a consolidation of lots request from Melody Hensley for lots located at 105 N. Fourth Street and 311 Central Avenue.
- 4) Approved a zoning permit request from Don Meulenberg/Superior Buildings, LLC. to construct an industrial building on Williams Avenue.
- 5) Approved a request to follow past procedure and authorize the cancellation of the November 28 and December 26, 2017 Town Council meetings due to their proximity to the holidays.
