

- 1) Greg Foltz addressed Council with a request to lower the Town's itinerant merchants' fee. Following a brief discussion, the Council agreed they would speak with the Towns of Stanley and Luray regarding the lowering of this fee, at each municipality, during their upcoming Joint Council meeting at the Stanley Fire Hall on March 21, 2018 at 7 PM. It was noted changing the itinerant merchants' fee in the Town of Shenandoah would require amending the Town Code.
- 2) Reviewed the January 2017 Police Department Activity log.
- 3) The Council was presented with a request from the Shenandoah Rescue Squad for a donation to their annual Appreciation Dinner. Following a brief discussion, it was agreed since the Town co-sponsored the 3rd Annual First Responders Dinner; a donation will not be made to the Shenandoah Rescue Squad at this time.
