- 1) Eleni Brick, with Thrasher Group, Inc., provided Mayor Lucas and Council with an update on the Preliminary Engineering Report they requested for improvements to be made to the Town's water and sewer system.
- 2) Authorized HighSpeedLink to install a Voice Over IP system to replace the current phone system at the Town Hall.
- 3) Reviewed the September 2018 Town Vehicle Gas Logs.
- 4) Received a thank you letter from the Shenandoah Valley Soil & Water Conservation District for the Town's \$375.00 donation for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year.
- 5) Heard Choices, the Council on Domestic Violence for Page County, has provided the Town Hall with free purple ribbon pins to recognize October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
