- 1) Following past procedure, Council authorized the cancellation of the November 26th and December 24th Town Council meetings, due to their proximity to the holidays.
- 2) Reviewed the October 2019 Town Vehicle Gas Logs.
- 3) Received a copy of the November 2019 Luray-Page County Chamber of Commerce & Visitor Center's Newsletter.
- 4) Heard the Luray-Page County Chamber of Commerce is holding their 5th Annual Holiday Open House Friday, December 6, 2019 from 4 pm to 7 pm. There will be caroling, reindeer food, ornament making, cookie decorating, cookies, hot cocoa, punch, and s'mores. Bring your kids, pets, and the whole family for photos – FREE with pet food, canned food, or a \$5 donation. All proceeds go to Page Paws & page One. Santa's Workshop is sponsored by the Page Valley Arts Council.
