

- 1) Kim Blosser, President of Lord Fairfax Community College thanked the Town for their donation to Foundation Building Fund. She noted attendees from the 22849-zip code had tripled in the last 4 years. The new facility should be finished on Christmas Day 2020 and will include programs like heavy equipment operator, etc.
- 2) Authorized a Resolution for the Mayor to sign and execute loan/grant documents for RUS to purchase a Utility 4x4 Truck and a Police SUV.
- 3) Authorized the purchase of 27 Historic Railroad Town Banners to replace banners on First Street in the amount of \$1,485.15 to be taken from the General Capital Outlay Miscellaneous budgeted line item.
- 4) Authorized the purchase of an upgraded utility metering system at a cost up to \$35,000 to be taken from the Utility Fund Reserved for Contingency budgeted line item. This upgraded utility metering system will include software, annual maintenance support, training and ERTs, eventually leading to a radio read system.
- 5) Authorized paving of roads/streets in Town at a total cost up to \$102,753. Please see list below for the breakdown:
 - a. Pave roads/streets and police parking lot at a cost up to \$92,753 from the General Fund Reserved for Contingency budgeted line item.
 - b. Pave/reseal Town Office Parking lot at a cost up to \$5,000 from the General Fund Municipal Building budgeted line item.
 - c. Pave/reseal River Park Walking Trail at a cost up to \$5,000 from the General Fund Parks & Recreation budgeted line item.
- 6) Approved water and sewer connections for Gary Bauserman on Shenandoah River Road, tax map # 102A1-(A)-28C.
- 7) Authorized purchasing a computer for the Police camera system up to \$2,000 to be taken from the General Fund Police Donations and Miscellaneous budgeted line items.
- 8) Authorized paying the Landfill tipping fees for the Shenandoah River Keepers clean up day on June 6th, 2020. They will clean by the riverbank below the dam. A Town riverbank cleanup is scheduled for April 25th for areas above the dam and along the Shenandoah River Road too.
- 9) February 2020 Vehicle Gas Log was presented.
- 10) February 2020 Budgets were presented.
