- 1) Presented the August 2020 Community Enhancement Award to T-Bowl Lanes for painting and improvements to the exterior and interior of the building.
- 2) Received listing of properties located within the Town limits that are due to be sold at the Page County Courthouse on September 9, 2020 at 1:00 PM. These properties are being sold due to delinquent real estate taxes owed to either the Town and/or to Page County.
- 3) Received the July 2020 Vehicle Gas logs for review.
- 4) Received a press release from Page County Development & Tourism announcing the award of over \$770,000 in State Grant Funds for COVID-19 Recovery. These funds are available to all Page County businesses in a first-come, first serve basis and can be used for a wide-range of expenses. The funds also include a Food Hub Grant to provide food assistance to laid off workers, etc.
- 5) Recommended the Page County Board of Supervisors appoint Jonathan Comer as the Town's representative on the Page County Economic Development Authority Board of Directors.
- 6) Heard Outdoor Movie Night, featuring "Monsters, Inc" will be shown at approximately 8:30 P.M on Thursday, August 27, 2020, weather permitting.
- 7) Accepted the resignation of the Town Clerk and approved advertising for the vacant position.
- 8) Adopted the final version of the Town of Shenandoah's Infectious Disease (COVID-19) Preparedness and Response Plan and Policy.
- 9) Heard the Town received used office furniture from the closing of Blue Ridge Bank's McGaheysville office, in large part due to Councilman Comer.
- 10) Heard violation letters for mowing and other issues on properties in Town have been mailed out to property owners in the past month.
- 11) Asked the Police Chief to research the criteria for hiring or training a Fire Marshall to assist with the issues of rundown properties in Town.
- 12) Heard the Boat Landing area is being overrun with ducks, possibly due to the increased number of people using the area and feeding them.
- 13) Heard the Ribbon Cutting and Business After Hours was a huge success, with seven new or expanded businesses occupying Town Center (formerly Village Shopping Center). Shop Local!
