- 11) Authorized purchase for 90 meter pots and lids and 50 cut off valves in the amount of \$15,822.00. Authorized payment to be transferred from the Water & Sewer Lines Replacement account to the Utility Capital Outlay Water & Sewer Line Replacement budgeted line item.
- 12) Heard that leaks have been fixed on Eighth Street, Ninth Street, and Second Street. The leak on North Fourth may have to be contracted out. The leak on Pennsylvania Avenue was patched for now. Supplies will be ordered, and new line will be run across the road to properly fix it.
- 13) Heard the well and water system are in compliance with the Virginia Department of Health's Annual Inspection. All required tests were done, with no violations.
- 14) Heard the DEQ will approve a 5 year Sewer Permit after a 30 day public comment period. There will be some new EPA required testing, but no violations.
- 15) Heard Carol Avenue, J Street, Kenesaw Avenue, and Coverstone Avenue have been paved. There is one section of Coverstone Lane to be paved later.
- 16) Heard 2 new playground structures are set to be installed at WigWam Village next week. Once installation is complete, the Town will plan a playground dedication ceremony.
- 17) With regrets, Mayor Lucas and Council accepted Officer Aaron Katz's resignation to explore other career objectives, effective June 1, 2021. The Town will probably promote a part-time Officer to full-time to fill Officer Katz's vacancy. Officer Katz will help for special events in the future as a part time officer.
