- 3) Approved payment in the amount up to \$92,213.00 to Burner Well Drilling, Inc. for drilling a new well. Authorized payment to be taken from the Utility Capital Improvement checking account to the Utility Fund. Burner Well Drilling will give the Town a discount if payment is made early.
- 4) Received a flyer advertising a "Back The Blue" ride through Rockingham and Page County to show support and appreciation for Law Enforcement.
